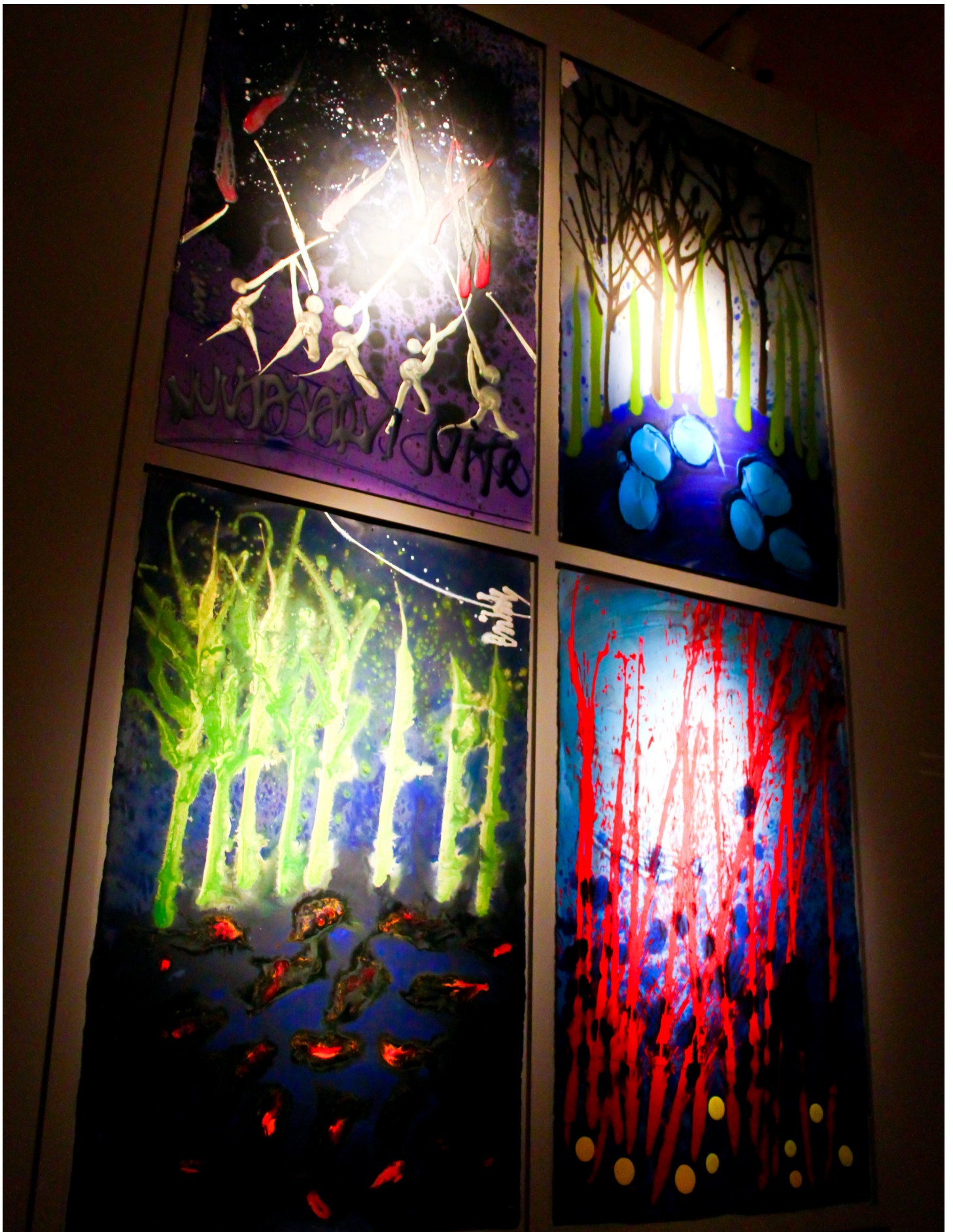

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President & CEO's Summary

Dear Members and Friends:

I am pleased to report to you on the activities and accomplishments of fiscal year 2010–2011. It was a very busy twelve months!

As I indicated last year, one of the central principles that we embrace as an institution is accessibility across the spectrum of our local and national community and beyond. With that vision for the future in mind, the Museum has worked tirelessly to reach out, and invite in, community members who have yet to experience OKCMOA and patrons who continue to support the organization. Over the past twelve months, the Museum made significant strides in reaching the community and establishing new connections and partnerships. Our focus on programming, particularly within the context of our core program areas, made for a number of highly thoughtful and successful initiatives.

I am proud to note that we again joined hundreds of museums across the United States and participated in the Blue Star Museums initiative that provided free admission to active duty military personnel and their families from Memorial Day to Labor Day. It is a small effort for each institution independently, but collectively it is a positive, symbolic message that we want to convey to our military families across the nation.

During fiscal year 2010–2011, we launched our first College Month at OKCMOA. College Month is a unique opportunity for students from Oklahoma higher education institutions to engage with the Museum free-of-charge during the month of September. In addition to free admission, the Museum offered targeted programming to college and university audiences. College Month underscores the Museum's commitment to creating a cultural legacy of art and education for the community.

We also created the Museum's first teen council, called the Youth Arts Advocates. The original YAA group consisted of 11 highly motivated, intelligent, and creative high school juniors and seniors with a passion for the visual arts. The purpose of the program is to engage this age group and to give them unique opportunities that will encourage their passion for art. Students met at the Museum monthly throughout the school year and had the opportunity to learn about various careers within the arts, organize and promote a film screening, and plan and organize an art event for teens.

In addition, we focused on developing a two-pronged healing arts program realized through important new partnerships. The first program is outreach to Epworth Villa and Cypress Springs to reach senior adults affected by Alzheimer's disease, and the second is outreach to hospitalized children and their families visiting The Zone at The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center. These programs serve as a vehicle for the Museum to extend its mission of enriching lives through the visual arts to those individuals in the community who would not ordinarily have the opportunity to visit the Museum. We are grateful to have the honor and privilege of working with these organizations and individuals.

As always, we offered numerous visitors a broad spectrum of educational opportunities that included camps, docent-led tours, studio art classes, family days, and the Yellow Bus Brigade program, which brings thousands of schoolchildren to the Museum each year for learning opportunities through an interdisciplinary educational approach in collaboration with schools and teachers throughout Oklahoma City and beyond. These initiatives effectively offer important services to the community as well as provide greater awareness of the Museum and of new partnership opportunities.

Looking at the permanent collection, we added 107 works of art to the Museum's holdings through purchases and gifts with the support of many generous patrons, along with an additional 18 films to the film collection. Highlights of these acquisitions include a spectacular piece of American decorative arts from 1780 attributed to Benjamin Frothingham, donated by Martha Williams in loving memory of her husband Dr. G. Rainey Williams, her parents Mr. and Mrs. Charles Alden Vose, and her grandparents Mr. and Mrs. Richard Alden Vose; fifty photographs by Brett Weston, through a gift of the Brett Weston Archive from the Christian K. Keesee Collection; an important lithograph by Luis Jiménez titled *Artist with Model*, 2007, donated by Joe A. Diaz; and a painting donated to the Museum by the Oklahoma Art League titled *Brittany Woman*, by Nellie Shepherd, from about 1910, which is a companion painting to *A Brittany Fisherman*, already in the collection.

A diverse and illuminating series of exhibitions were presented to the delight of over 125,000 Museum guests. These exhibits helped to attract people from throughout Oklahoma City and surrounding states, as well as visitors from across the country and around the globe. The shows ranged from major exhibitions organized by the Museum, and major travelling exhibitions, to smaller, more intimate presentations. Examples of these fine productions include *La Serenissima: Eighteenth-Century Art from North American Collections*; *George Nelson: Architect, Writer, Designer, Teacher*; *Alfonso Ossorio: Gifts from the Ossorio Foundation*; *Passages*; *Jill Downen: COUNTERPARTS*; *Sketch to Screen: The Art of*

Hollywood Costume Design; Amy Blakemore: Photographs 1988-2008, and more. We are so grateful to our Museum sponsors for providing critical financial support that makes our work in the presentation of art, and the production of new scholarship, possible.

Building on the success of the previous fiscal year, the film program had another record-breaking year. The Nordic film sensation, *The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo*, became the top-grossing film in our program's history, helping annual attendance to exceed our previous record. The Museum hosted numerous events, created new collaborations, and formed new partnerships as we embarked on one of the most active and exciting film years ever.

The Museum Cafe continued to provide incredible service and amazing meals to the delight of all our guests. We provide full-service lunch and dinner, and brunch on Sunday, as well offer a full bar, catering services, and high tea! I am so pleased to share with you that the Museum Cafe had a couple of first-time experiences in fiscal year 2010-2011. We had our first-ever, sold-out beer dinner and received fantastic coverage in the Wall Street Journal in an article on museums with great wines, alongside some of the nation's greatest art institutions. We were named one of the top fifty brunch locations in the USA by Open Table diners, and we had our best month ever during the month of June 2011!

Fundraising efforts continued with wonderful success this year, thanks to our generous sponsors, friends, Board of Trustees, and great development staff. We are so fortunate to be able to report robust support through membership, the annual fund, in-kind contributions, and endowment gifts. I am pleased to share with you that in November 2010 the Friends' Lecture Series was named the James C. Meade Friends' Lecture Series in honor of longtime Friends Chairman James C. Meade. The Board of Trustees further moved to create the James C. Meade Friends' Lecture Series Endowment in honor of Mr. Meade. Each of the fundraisers and benefits this year exceeded our expectations, including the Renaissance Ball, Beaux Arts Ball, Art on Tap, and the Omelette Party, which brought many people together, and through their participation, helped this institution continue to succeed.

On March 16, 2012, the Oklahoma City Museum of Art, Donald W. Reynolds Visual Arts Center, will celebrate its 10th anniversary in downtown Oklahoma City. In preparation for this significant milestone, and after successfully completing the multi-phase, reaccreditation process with the American Association of Museums, we developed a series of program initiatives and community events that will be launched on New Year's Eve 2011. The Museum's 10th Anniversary Celebration, A Cultural Legacy, supports our mission, and our purpose to create a cultural legacy of art and education, and will be a way for the Museum to say thank you to the Oklahoma City community for a decade of amazing support.

The Museum's commitment to excellence and professional standards of operation remains at the top of our list of achievements. We continue to engage in an ongoing process of learning and improvement that underscores the superb teamwork of board and staff and recognizes effective action in museum practice at all levels of the institution's operations, as well as in stewardship and governance. The wonderful service and support provided by the Museum's board leadership, members, staff, and hundreds of volunteers made it possible for us to continue to deliver our mission to enrich lives through the visual arts, and thus contribute to improving the quality of life in Oklahoma City and beyond.

I wish to thank you for your generous contributions throughout the year and for your participation in the Museum's programming. Your unwavering commitment and your generous support are deeply appreciated.

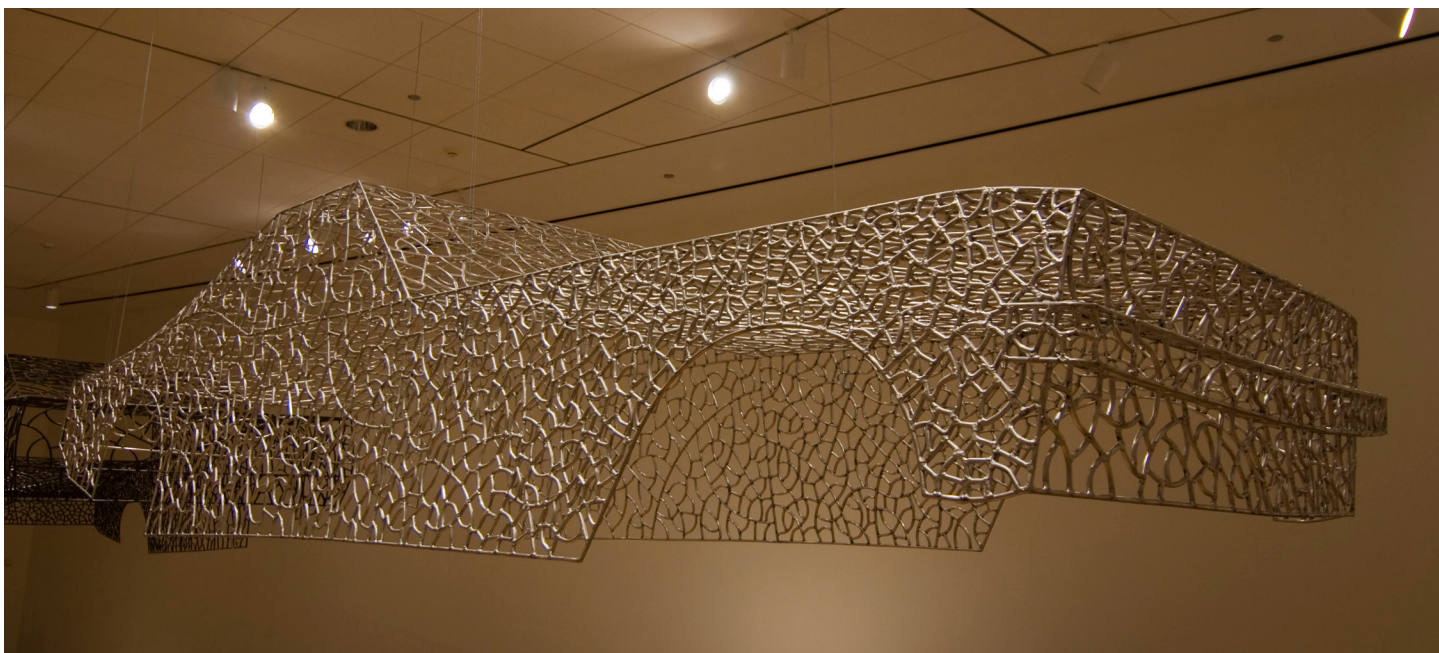

EXHIBITION

Building on the success of the previous fiscal year, the film program had yet another record-breaking year for the number of screenings offered (325), attendance (21,135), and revenue. One of the highlights of the summer was the Sketch to Screen Film Festival, in conjunction with the popular gallery exhibition *Sketch to Screen: The Art of Hollywood Costume Design*, that included sold-out screenings of *Mamma Mia! Sing-along* and *Gone with the Wind*.

With the return engagement of *The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo*, this Swedish literary/film sensation became the all-time, top-grossing film at the Noble Theater. The film's two sequels, *The Girl Who Played with Fire* and *The Girl Who Kicked the Hornet's Nest*, became the program's second and fourth best-earning films ever thanks to return engagements by popular demand. Other box office hits were *Exit through the Gift Shop*, *Winter's Bone*, Sundance Short Films, Oscar Nominated Short Films, and *Bill Cunningham New York*.

Audiences had a rare opportunity to see, for the first time in our state, the acclaimed contemporary artist Matthew Barney's complete Cremaster Cycle. Among the other thematic programs offered were French Cinema Week; Four Cinematic Views of Venice, related to the *La Serenissima* exhibition; American Indian Cinema Showcase; New Jewish Cinema; 1934 Film Series; and Green Screen, featuring four new documentaries about people and the planet on which we live. The annual Film Preservation Festival, in cooperation with the University of Central Oklahoma, had a French theme with classic films by Jean-Luc Godard and Jacques Tati.

EVENTS

The Museum was one of the first venues in the country to screen the mockumentary *Certifiably Jonathan* starring the comedian/painter Jonathan Winters. A small exhibition of Winters' surrealist paintings were displayed in Founders Hall and the filmmakers, Jim Pasternak and Richard Marshall, did a live Skype Q&A with audiences. Filmmakers Amanda Pope and Tchavdar Georgiev also appeared for a live Q&A via Skype after the final screening of the fascinating documentary *The Desert of Forbidden Art*.

Filmmaker Eric Bricker returned to OKCMOA in person for another screening of *Visual Acoustics: The Modernism of Julius Shulman*. Local poets Tim Bradford, Matt Hollrah, and Carol Hamilton did live readings in memory of Allen Ginsburg prior to the screenings of *Howl*. The Japan Foundation, New York, in collaboration with the University of Oklahoma, sponsored a free screening of classic Japanese ghost tale *Kwaidan*. Ruth Myers presented a fashion show prior to one of the screenings of *Bill Cunningham New York*.

In a new partnership with the Museum, Belgian brewery Stella Artois, a global supporter of independent film, provided free product between several screenings throughout the year: *Winnebago Man*, Sundance Shorts, *The Harmony Game: The Making of Bridge Over Troubled Water*, *Breathless*, and *The Promise: The Making of Darkness On the Edge of Town*.

The Museum's inaugural Youth Arts Advocates group worked with Brian Hearn, film curator, and Sheila Hallett, community outreach coordinator, to organize and promote a public screening of *American Teen* followed by a panel discussion about school stereotypes led by members of the Youth Arts Advocates.

In collaboration with the Oklahoma Film & Music Office, the film program participated in the SXSW Red Dirt Reel Film Industry Reception at the South by Southwest (SXSW) Film, Music and Interactive Festival in Austin, Texas. This inaugural event, held at the Buffalo Lounge on Austin's famed 6th Street, promoted Oklahoma's film locations, financing, distribution, exhibition, and festivals to the larger film industry. The Red Dirt Reel was coproduced by the Oklahoma Film & Music Office, the Oklahoma City Chamber of Commerce, OKCMOA Film Program, Circle Cinema, deadCENTER Film Festival, Black Mesa Entertainment, and Indian Entertainment Group.

Education & Public Programs

EDUCATION & PUBLIC PROGRAMS

During fiscal year 2010–11, the Oklahoma City Museum of Art organized and presented educational activities and events both at the Museum and at K–12 schools and universities, senior activity and memory care centers, hospitals, and other locations throughout the Oklahoma City metro area that reached 37,847 participants.

MUSEUM SCHOOL

Museum School, which offers formal visual arts instruction to adults and children, served more than 1,700 students in 190 classes, workshops, and camps.

ADULT PROGRAMS

Over 3,600 adults benefited from the Museum's travel tour program, lectures, talks, performances, and Last Call events.

FAMILY PROGRAMS

More than 100 family programs reached just over 3,000 children and adults through exhibition-themed Family Day events, informal Drop-in Art activities, Discovery Packs activity backpacks, and Tiny Tuesdays art activities for children ages 2–5.

OUTREACH

A total of 3,754 participants benefited from the Museum's outreach programs. The Museum worked with the Oklahoma City Philharmonic to provide a hands-on art activity for families attending the Discovery Concert series. A new partnership was established with the OU Children's Hospital to bring art activities to The Zone, a 6,000-square-foot facility used as a recreation room for children and families staying in the hospital for prolonged treatment. The Museum organized for a teaching artist to visit the Zone and guide children and teens in art making to educate them and serve as a therapeutic outlet for stress and anxiety associated with their illness. Senior Outreach was expanded with a new program designed to help senior adults suffering from Alzheimer's disease. The Museum worked with memory care centers Cypress Springs and Epworth Villa, bringing a teaching artist to them monthly to create art with their Alzheimer's residents. OKCMOA also initiated its first teen art council, the Youth Arts Advocates, which consisted of 11 high school juniors and seniors who worked closely with Museum staff, met monthly to learn about careers within the arts, and organized a film event for teens.

TOURS

Forty-six volunteer docents donated approximately 700 hours in training and tours. Seven new docents were recruited and trained. The Museum's Yellow Bus Brigade scholarship program, funded in part by a challenge grant from the Inasmuch Foundation, provided free admission and busing to 3,465 students from across the state.

SCHOOL AND TEACHER PROGRAMS

The Museum offered two events for educators: a teacher workshop and a teacher institute. Both programs presented information on exhibitions and the permanent collection at OKCMOA, as well as classroom connections with hands-on activities and suggested lesson plans that meet PASS and Core Curriculum requirements in the areas of Visual Arts, Social Studies, and Language Arts.

The Museum, in conjunction with the Oklahoma Art Education Association, sponsored its fourth Portfolio Day on January 14, 2011, which was open to all Oklahoma junior and senior students. Representatives of art faculties from Oklahoma and other regional colleges and universities evaluated 136 students' portfolios in preparation for admission and scholarship applications.

The Museum placed twenty-nine college students—recent graduates and graduate students—in the internships serving Curatorial, Film, Education, Marketing, and Development departments. Additionally, over 1,250 students from colleges and universities took advantage of the Museum's first ever College Month. The unique program engaged college students with art and the public programs presented at the Museum.

OMELETTE PARTY

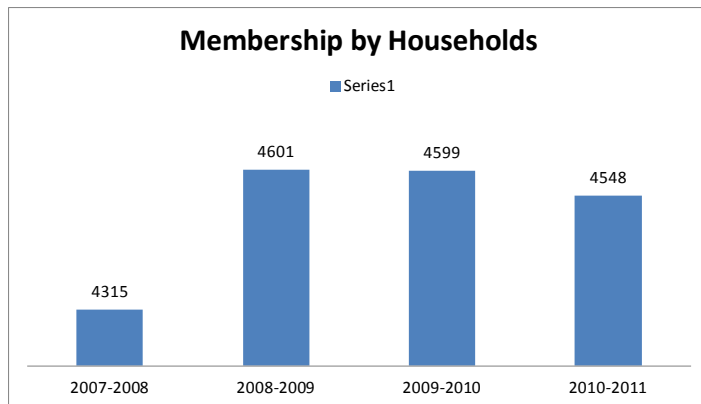

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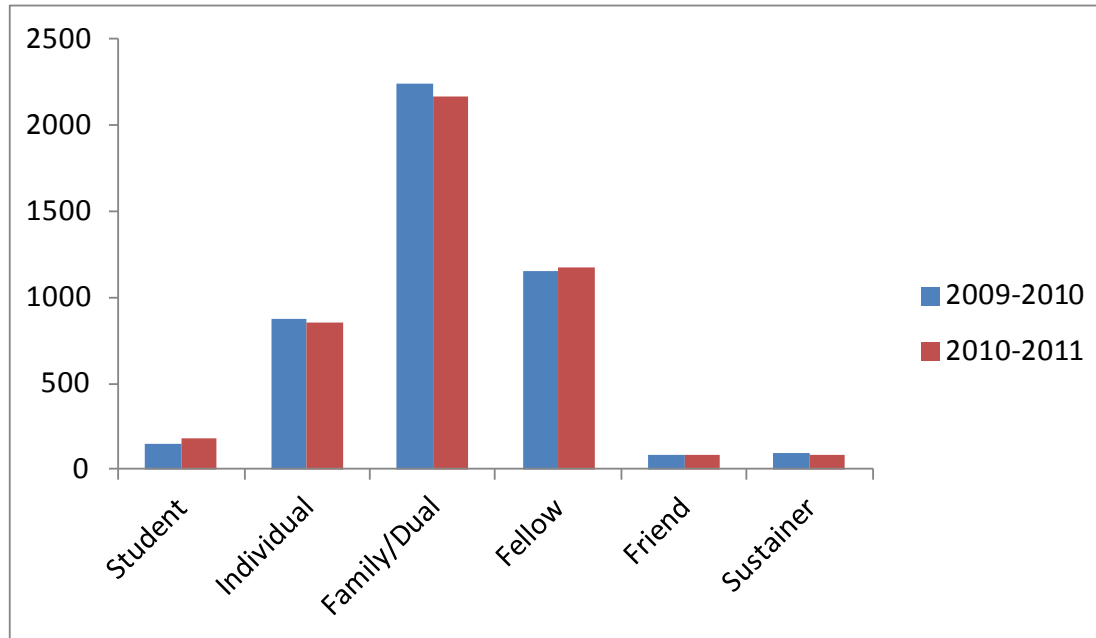

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The Oklahoma City Museum of Art is a privately supported, cultural institution. As such, the Museum's Season Sponsorship Program is a critical component of its annual funding. Season Sponsors support programming for the entire season, July 1 through June 30, each year. The Allied Arts Fund Drive is an annual effort to secure vital operating support for twenty arts agencies in central Oklahoma. The campaign raised nearly \$2 million during the 2010-2011 year.

ACQUISITION AND PROGRAM SPONSORSHIPS

The Museum received major funding designated for acquisitions, exhibitions, Films and education programs during the 2010-2011 fiscal year. Our deepest gratitude is extended to:

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The Annual Fund supports the Museum in its areas of greatest need with contributions of more than \$300,000. This support is used to fund a host of activities and programs, including special film events, lectures, school bus tours, Museum School classes and camps, as well as special exhibitions. Additionally, these funds assisted with crucial, general operating costs, which range from lighting the galleries and ensuring ample security to maintaining visitor services.

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The Museum received \$145,750 in endowment gifts during 2010-2011. A gift to one of the Museum's endowments assists with long-term funding of programs, acquisitions, and general operating. Endowment gifts are a viable way to contribute to the financial health of the institution in perpetuity.

MUSEUM STORE

The Museum Store ended the fiscal year with \$245,000 in sales. Popular items included Bijoux Artisan jewelry from Lucy Lu, a plethora of art and educational children's toys, unique home and office gifts, and the beautiful Chihuly Pergola Umbrella. The *Chihuly Oklahoma City Museum of Art* book and note card set, containing vibrant pictures of the Museum's treasured collection of Chihuly glass, continued to enthrall and connect with customers and remained popular. The store's open hours were maintained at seven days a week to increase availability to customers and stayed open late during Art After 5PM. The store continued to offer gift cards, personal shopping, special orders, and shipping worldwide.

MUSEUM CAFE

In 2010–11, the Museum Cafe increased sales by \$171,862.72, with \$1,436,786.81 in total sales for the fiscal year. A large part of this increase was from catered events, of which food sales totaled \$189,852.28. And in 2011, the Museum Cafe was named one of the Top 50 Brunch locations in the US by Open Table diners.

In August 2010, the cafe underwent a mini face-lift with new paint, a deep cleaning of all behind-the-scenes areas, and the addition of a TV in the bar to feature sports and current affairs. Additionally, Museum Cafe Tea hours and days were expanded, Tuesday through Friday, 3–5 p.m., and more selections were added, including a children's tea.

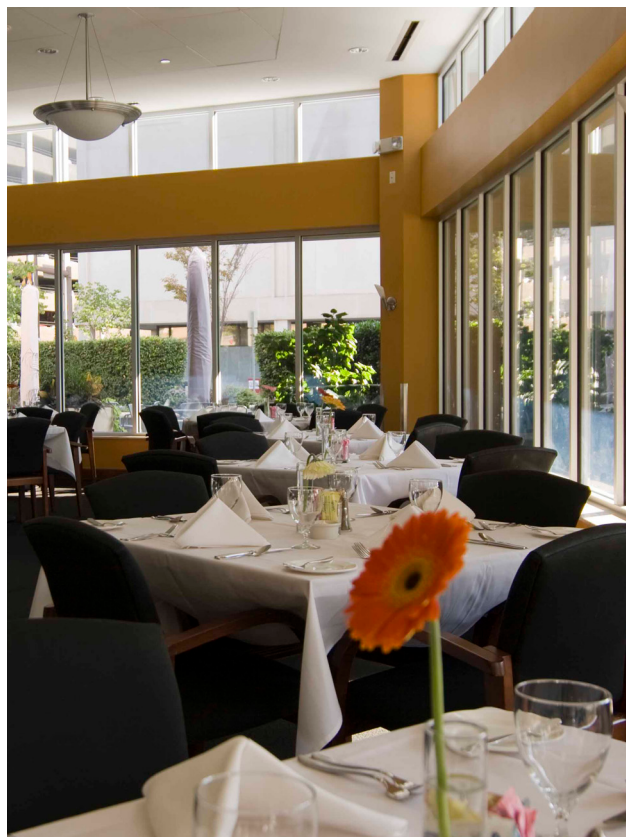
The first-ever, sold-out beer dinner was held on July 26, 2010, and featured Boulevard Brewing Companies Smokestack Series. The cafe also hosted a seven course wine dinner featuring Banfi wines on September 27, 2010, as well as a beer dinner featuring Unibroue Belgian-Style Brews on December 6, 2010. These were some of the most popular, special dinners hosted at the cafe, and all menus were created by Sous Chef Henry Boudreaux.

In early 2011, Executive Chef Gayland Toriello and Sous Chef Henry Boudreaux competed in the state level Taste of Elegance pork competition sponsored by the Pork Council. They took first place in this event and went on to compete at the national level in Baltimore, Maryland. On February 17, 2011, Chef Toriello participated in the Chefs Recipe Challenge for News OK, and his Fried Chicken recipe was featured as a very successful special in the cafe the following week. Sous Chef Henry Boudreaux also participated in the Oklahoma Cattle Women's Beef Chef Competition in January where he placed third overall.

In January 2011, the Museum created the Mezzanine Private Dining Room, called The Mezz, that seats up to 36 guests for lunch or dinner and holds up to 60 guests for receptions.

The wine list was updated in May of 2011, with 130 selections removed and about 115 added. The update cut the selection of wines by the glass and increased half bottle sales by adding more varieties. Shortly following, the Museum Cafe was featured in *The Wall Street Journal* on June 4, 2011, in an article on museums with great wines alongside The Museum of Modern Art, the Denver Art Museum, The J. Paul Getty Museum, and the Baltimore Museum of Art.

Additional events included a catered dinner for Bill Maher when he performed at the Civic Center in the spring of 2011. Cafe staff participated in the OKC Beautiful Annual Litter Blitz and cleaned up trash surrounding the Museum and two square blocks in the Arts District. Cocktails on the Skyline continued to grow and bring an array of people to the Museum, and the Museum Cafe continued to support area charities, benefits, and nonprofits, including Automobile Alley's Chocolate Decadence, Allied Arts' Martini Party, and OKCMOA's Omelette Party and ARTonTAP, with donations of gift certificates and food.

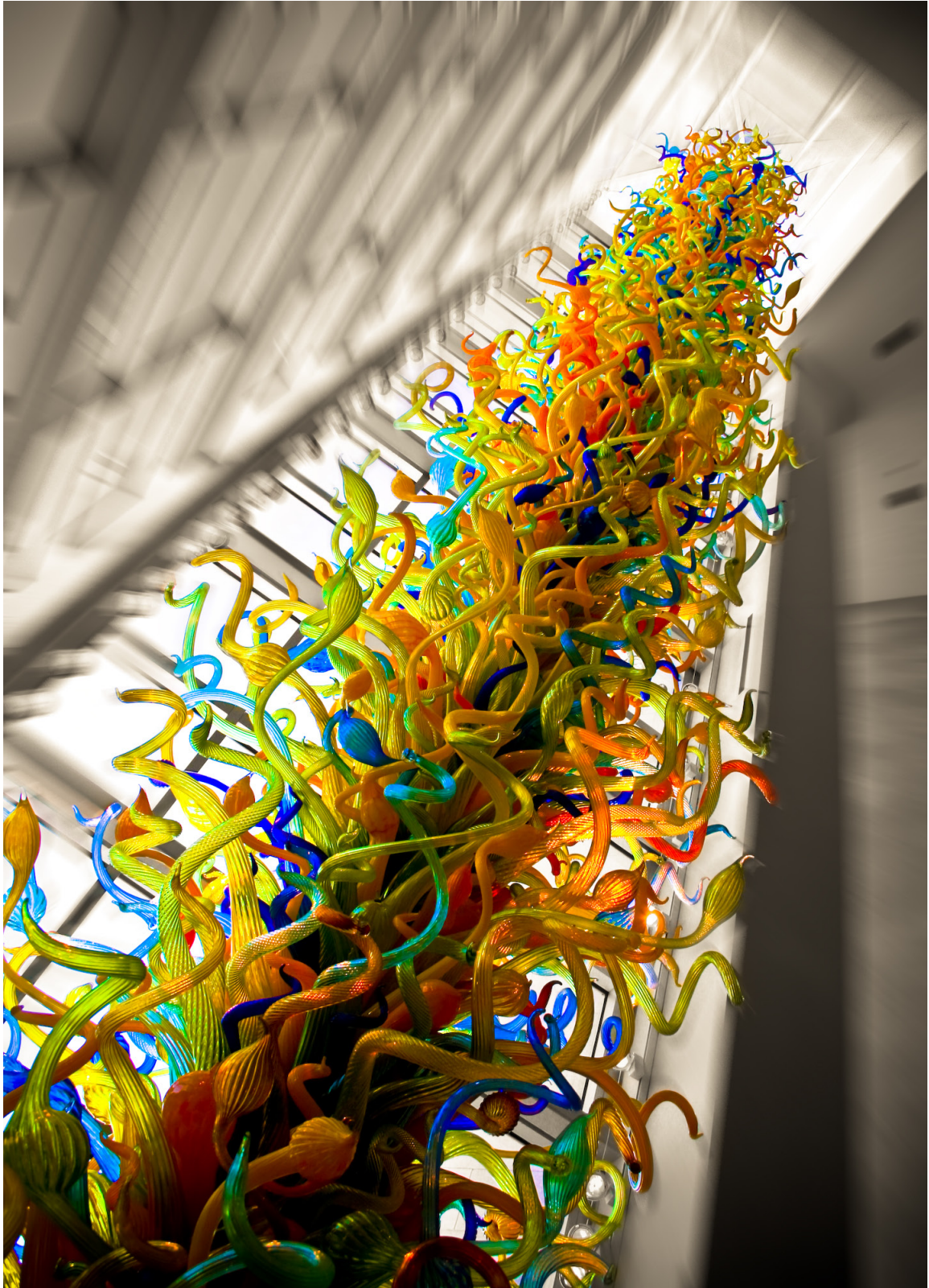

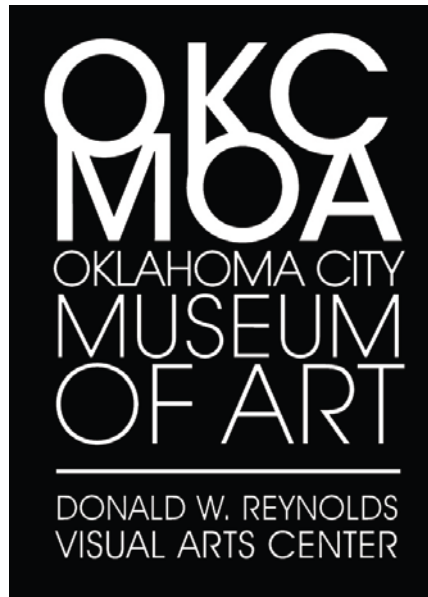

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

June 30, 2011 and 2010

Note 1 – Organization

The Oklahoma City Museum of Art, Inc. (the Museum) is a privately-funded museum located at the Donald W. Reynolds Visual Arts Center. The three-story, 110,000 square-foot Visual Arts Center features 15 galleries showcasing the Museum's collections, temporary exhibitions organized by the Museum, and world-class traveling exhibitions. It offers the only comprehensive film program in the region. The Museum is accredited by the American Association of Museums and is an Allied Arts Member Agency. The Museum's mission is to enrich lives through the visual arts. The Museum's purpose is to create a cultural legacy in art and education for current and future generations to experience at the Museum and carry with them throughout their lives.

The Donald W. Reynolds Visual Arts Center, funded in part by a \$14.5 million capital grant from the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation, Las Vegas, Nevada, is part of the Museum's completed \$40 million project to fund the new Visual Arts Center expansion and endowment. The project was completed through private funding and was not a part of the Oklahoma City MAPS sales tax program. The Museum received significant funds from the general public and from private foundations.

The Museum is the sole owner of the Museum of Art Cafe, Inc. (the Café). The Café is located in the Donald W. Reynolds Visual Arts Center and provides full-service lunch and dinner in a casually elegant dining atmosphere.

The Museum is the sole owner of Museum Parking, LLC, which was formed on January 28, 2009, to acquire a parcel of land functioning as a parking lot in the vicinity of the Museum. Museum Parking, LLC leases the parking lot to a third-party operator.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Consolidated financial statements

The consolidated financial statements of the Oklahoma City Museum of Art, Inc. and subsidiaries include the accounts of the Museum, the Café, and Museum Parking, LLC (collectively OKCMOA). All material intercompany transactions have been eliminated.

Basis of accounting and reporting

The consolidated financial statements of OKCMOA are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Separate funds are utilized to account for the Museum's various activities. The assets, liabilities and net assets of OKCMOA are reported as follows:

- Unrestricted net assets represent the portion of expendable funds that are available for support of OKCMOA operations. At June 30, 2011 and 2010, unrestricted net assets of \$2,926,862 and \$2,552,567, respectively, were designated for specific purposes by the Museum's Board of Trustees.

- Temporarily restricted net assets represent funds with donor-designated restrictions for acquisitions, capital campaign funds, maintenance of art objects or specific programs.
- Permanently restricted net assets represent funds that are subject to donor-designated restrictions requiring the principal to be invested in perpetuity.

Cash and restrictions

Cash consists of cash on hand and deposits in banks. OKCMOA maintains its cash balances in high credit quality financial institutions. At times, OKCMOA's cash may exceed federally insured limits, but OKCMOA believes any possible credit risk is minimal.

At June 30, 2011 and 2010, the Museum had cash contributions restricted by the donor for specific purposes of \$645,162 and \$545,421, respectively.

Receivables

The Museum has receivables, reflected as grants and accounts receivable and grants and accounts receivable with restrictions in the accompanying consolidated statements of financial position, which represent promises to give that have been made by donors, but have not yet been received by the Museum. The Museum provides an allowance for doubtful accounts based upon a review of the current status of its receivables. At June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, no allowance for doubtful accounts was deemed necessary by the Museum.

Due to the nature of these pledges, significant increases and decreases in net assets may occur. These significant fluctuations can arise as contributions and are recognized as support in the period in which they are pledged, but the expenses incurred with such contributions may occur in a different period.

Inventories

Inventories, which include products for sale in the Museum store, food and beverage items in the Café, and miscellaneous supplies, are stated at the lower of cost or market determined by the first-in, first-out method.

Investments

Investments, which include money market instruments, equity securities, U.S. government securities, and corporate bonds and debentures, are stated at estimated fair value (based on quoted market prices) with unrealized gains and losses reported in the consolidated statement of activities for the year. Donated investment instruments are initially recorded at estimated fair value at the date of donation.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment is recorded at historical cost or estimated value at date of donation. Depreciation of these assets is provided on the straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets, which range from 2 to 40 years. Maintenance and repair costs are expensed as incurred, while renewals and betterments are capitalized and depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Upon disposition, the cost and related accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and the resulting gain or loss is reflected in the consolidated statement of activities for the year.

Art and library collections

The Museum's art and library collections are made up of historically significant art, contemporary art and other art objects that are held for educational, research, and curatorial purposes. Each item is cataloged, preserved, and cared for, and activities verifying their existence and assessing their condition are performed continuously. Art and library collections, which were acquired through purchases and contributions since the Museum's inception are insured under the Museum's fine art insurance policy, and are not capitalized and recognized as assets in the consolidated statement of financial position. Purchases of collection items are recorded as decreases in unrestricted net assets in the year in which the items are acquired or as temporarily or permanently restricted net assets if the assets used to purchase the items are restricted by donors. Contributions of collection items are not recognized in the statement of activities. Proceeds from deaccessions or insurance recoveries are reflected as increases in the appropriate net assets classification. The Museum's policy provides for deaccessioning works that do not fit into the collections plan or that are of poor quality or condition. Any funds made available by the sale of unrestricted deaccessioned works are used for acquisitions to strengthen the collection.

Contributions to the Museum

The Museum reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished) temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and are reported in the consolidated statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Net assets with restrictions, which are met in the same reporting period as their receipt, are presented as part of unrestricted net assets.

The Museum reports gifts of land, buildings, and equipment as unrestricted support unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long-lived assets must be maintained, the Museum reports expirations of donor restrictions when the donated or acquired long-lived assets are placed in service.

The Museum reports bequests as temporarily restricted support in contributed income when notice has been received and becomes legally enforceable. Once funds are received, bequests are considered available for general use, unless restricted for a specific use or for an endowment fund by the donor.

Income tax status

The Museum is a nonprofit organization and is exempt from income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501. However, the Museum is subject to federal income tax on any unrelated business taxable income.

The accounting for income taxes may, at times, involve some degree of uncertainty, and as such, lead to uncertain tax positions having been taken. Management evaluated the Museum's tax positions and concluded that the Museum had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements to comply with the provisions of this guidance. Generally, the Museum is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. federal, state or local tax authorities for years prior to 2008.

Allocation of expenses

OKCMOA allocates salaries and wages based on actual staff position. Administrative expenses are allocated to each area based on an estimate of usage. All remaining expenses are allocated based on actual expenditures for the function.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires OKCMOA to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Concentration of credit risk

Financial instruments, which potentially subject OKCMOA to credit risk, consist of grants and accounts receivable, grants and accounts receivable with restrictions, and investments.

The Museum's investments consist of various stocks, bonds and U.S. Treasury notes. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect the investment account balances and the amounts reported in the consolidated statements of financial position and the consolidated statements of activities.

Advertising expense

All advertising costs are expensed as incurred. Advertising expenses were approximately \$248,000 and \$284,000 for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively.

Subsequent events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 28, 2011, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the 2010 consolidated financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the 2011 presentation. These reclassifications had no effect on previously reported changes in net assets.

Note 3 – Donated Services

OKCMOA has an affiliated volunteer group known as the Beaux Arts Committee which hosts an annual fundraiser benefiting the Museum's Beaux Arts Acquisitions Trust. The Museum recorded contributions from this group of \$50,000 and \$40,000 for the fiscal years 2011 and 2010, which are included in individuals contributed income in the consolidated statements of activities.

A substantial number of volunteers have made significant contributions of their time to develop the Museum's programs, of which no value was assigned.

⁽¹⁾ In May 2009, the Board of Directors approved an inter-fund borrowing from the Raymond A. and Verna N. Young Endowment fund to operating cash in the amount of \$500,000. The purpose of the inter-fund borrowing was to address budget shortfalls and cash flow needs. Principal payments are to be repaid through budget surpluses over a term of five years. Interest expense on the borrowing is to be paid through operations. During the year ended June 30, 2011, \$240,000 was paid from operating cash and applied to the inter-fund balance. Subsequent to June 30, 2011, an additional \$130,000 was applied to the inter-fund balance from operating cash.

Investments without restrictions are maintained in funds as shown for the following purposes:

- The Raymond A. and Verna N. Young Endowment represents the funds originally designated for the construction of the Museum building. Since the construction has been completed, the funds became unrestricted for use in general operations of the Museum.
- The interest and unrealized investment gains generated from the Museum Legacy Endowment are unrestricted and available for use in general Museum operations.
- The Westheimer Family Endowment and related interest and unrealized investment gains generated from the funds are available for use for the Museum's programs and operations with first priority for the proper maintenance, display, and preservation of the Westheimer Family Collection.

Investments with restrictions are maintained in funds as shown for the following purposes:

- The Museum Acquisitions Trust and Beaux Arts Acquisitions Trust are temporarily restricted funds maintained for the purchase and maintenance of art objects for the Museum.
- The Thatcher Hoffman Smith Film Endowment includes funds maintained for the purpose of supporting the Museum's comprehensive film program. This is a permanent endowment, with the principal required to be maintained in perpetuity and the interest being expendable for the stated purpose of the fund.
- The Sarkeys Foundation Arts Education Endowment is maintained for education programming. Like the Thatcher Hoffman Smith Film Endowment, this is also a permanent endowment, with the principal required to be maintained in perpetuity and the interest being expendable for the stated purpose of the endowment.
- The Sonic America's Drive-In Arts Education Endowment is permanently restricted for education programming.
- The Museum Legacy Endowment includes funds solicited from donors to provide for a permanent endowment for the Museum. The principal amount of these funds will not be expended. Interest and unrealized gains generated by the endowment principal may be used for general Museum operations.
- The Donald W. Reynolds Visual Arts Center Building Maintenance Endowment represents funds temporarily restricted for maintenance of the Museum in the Donald W. Reynolds Visual Arts Center facility. It is the Museum's intention to use only the income generated from the endowment principal for the maintenance and upkeep of the building as directed by the grant agreement.
- The Records Family Endowment was established as a permanent endowment to support Museum operations. The principal amount of these funds will not be expended. Distributions of interest and unrealized gains generated by the endowment principal may be used for general Museum operations.

Investment income is reported net of related investment expenses. Investment expense was \$28,713 and \$25,254 for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively.

Note 6 – Contributions to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation

A separate fund, the Oklahoma City Museum of Art Affiliated Fund (the Affiliated Fund), is established at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation (OCCF). Contributions received subsequent to July 1, 1991, by OCCF, which are designated to be invested to benefit the Museum, are placed in the Affiliated Fund. Investment decisions for the Affiliated Fund are made by a five-member panel that includes three representatives appointed by OCCF and two representatives appointed by the Museum's Board of Trustees. Income earned on the donated funds is paid to the Museum on a basis determined by the five-member panel. The principal amount of the Affiliated Fund cannot be distributed without the unanimous approval of the OCCF Board of Directors. As a result, OCCF has variance power and the Museum has not recorded these funds as an asset in its statement of position.

The Fee-Milligan Operating Endowment (the Endowment) within the Affiliated Fund includes funds transferred by the Museum to OCCF, with the Museum designating itself as beneficiary of the fund. The Museum's Board of Trustees has authorized OCCF to manage the Endowment in the same manner as the Affiliated Fund assets, which effectively grants variance power to OCCF. However, as the Museum designated itself as beneficiary for the Endowment, the Museum recognizes a beneficial interest in the Endowment assets held by OCCF in its statements of financial position.

The market value of the entire Affiliated Fund, which includes the beneficial interest Endowment funds, was \$7,617,502 and \$6,347,390, at June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively. As a result of OCCF's variance power over the funds contributed by unrelated donors, the Museum has not recorded the remaining value of the Affiliated Fund of \$3,961,893 and \$3,442,517 at June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, as an asset in the accompanying consolidated statements of financial position. Investment income distributed to the Museum from OCCF is classified as unrestricted support in the consolidated statements of activities.

In addition, OCCF maintains an account for funds designated for Museum acquisitions of art (the Designated Fund). Earnings are not distributed but, rather, are retained in the Designated Fund under the control of OCCF until requested by the Museum for an acquisition of art. The expendable balance in the Designated Fund was \$22,908 and \$19,338 at June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, and is recorded in grants and accounts receivable in the consolidated statements of financial position.

In August 2006, the Museum entered into an endowment agreement with James C. and Virginia W. Meade (the Meades) to establish a permanent endowment named "*The James C. and Virginia W. Meade Collections Endowment*" for the purpose of supporting acquisitions for the Museum's collections and furtherance of the Museum's mission. Under the terms of this agreement (and a related agreement between the Meades, the Museum and the OCCF), the Meades pledged \$1,000,000 to the Museum to be contributed over a three-year period and invested in the Affiliated Fund at OCCF. The annual distribution from the fund will generally be 5% of the average market value based upon certain restrictions intended to protect and preserve the original corpus of the endowment.

In May 2007, OCCF received a direct gift of \$250,000 to establish the Pauline Morrison Ledbetter Fund to benefit OKCMOA. At the direction of the donor, this gift established an acquisitions endowment fund whereby two-thirds of the earnings of the funds are available for the purchase of art and sculpture for the Museum and the remaining one-third of earnings reinvested in the endowment. Because OCCF retains variance power over these funds, the endowment is not recorded in the statement of financial position of OKCMOA. The expendable balance in the Pauline Morrison Ledbetter Fund was \$15,263 and \$7,450 at June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, and is recorded in grants and accounts receivable in the consolidated statements of financial position.

In December 2008, the Museum established an endowment agreement with OCCF to establish a permanent endowment named "*Carolyn A. Hill Collections Endowment*" for the purpose of supporting acquisitions for the Museum's collections. Under the terms of this agreement, the annual distribution from the fund will generally be 5% of the average market value based upon certain restrictions intended to protect and preserve the original corpus of the endowment.

Note 7 – Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification established a consistent framework for measuring fair value and fair value hierarchy based on the observability of inputs used to measure fair value.

The underlying investments include cash equivalents, corporate obligations, equity securities and other investments. The fair values of the underlying investments are based on quoted prices from active and inactive markets.

As described in Note 5, the investment income on the Thatcher Hoffman Smith Film Endowment and the Sarkeys Foundation Arts Education Endowment can be expended for the stated purposes of each endowment. The investment income and unrealized gains on the Museum Legacy Endowment can be expended for general Museum operations.

Note 10 – Donor-Restricted and Board-Designated Endowments

Board interpretation

The Board of Trustees has interpreted state law as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the gifts of the donor-restricted endowment funds unless explicit donor stipulations specify otherwise. To meet that objective, the Museum's endowment investment, management and distribution policies require that the corpus, meaning the fair value of the original and subsequent gifts as of the gift date, be maintained in perpetuity, with the earnings available to support the Museum's ongoing operations and programs.

State law allows the Board to appropriate or accumulate so much of an endowment fund as the Museum determines is prudent for the uses, benefits, purposes, and duration for which the endowment is established. The law requires the Board to prudently consider, if relevant, the general economic conditions, possible effect of inflation or deflation, expected total return, other resources of the institution, and the institution's investment policy.

Return objectives, risk parameters, strategies and spending policy

The principal goal of the Museum's investment program is to administer and invest funds received from donors in a prudent manner. The financial objective for the Museum's endowment funds is governed by guidelines specific to each separate investment portfolio. The overall financial objective is to maximize the risk-adjusted investment return while maintaining adequate levels of liquidity. The Museum relies on a total return strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and current yield (interest and dividends). Risk of large losses is minimized by a diversified asset allocation. The current investment allocation of 55% equities and 45% fixed income, with quarterly performance reviews, is expected to achieve the long-term return objectives within prudent risk constraints.

Under the Investment Policy, the total return on investments is expected to exceed a benchmark consisting of the appropriate percent of the Standard & Poor's 500 Index and the Barclays Capital U.S. Government Bond Index that matches the equity and fixed income diversification of the portfolio over an average period of five consecutive years. The total return, after fees, from all unrestricted equity securities should equal or exceed the total return on the Standard & Poor's 500 Index over a period of five consecutive fiscal years.

Under the Museum's endowment distribution policy, the amount available for appropriation each year is 5% of the average market value of the endowment at the end of each of the last 12 calendar quarters, provided that the appropriation would not cause the remaining market value of the endowment fund to be less than the corpus. This policy is expected to allow for real growth in addition to building the endowments through new gifts and return on investment.

From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor or state law requires the Museum to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. While there were no such deficiencies as of June 30, 2011, deficiencies reported in unrestricted net assets as of June 30, 2010, were \$122,692. These deficiencies resulted from unfavorable market fluctuations that occurred shortly after the investment of new permanently restricted contributions and continued appropriation for certain programs that was deemed prudent by the Board of Directors.

Note 11 – Note Payable

In August 2009, Museum Parking, LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Museum, entered into an agreement to purchase a tract of land in the vicinity of the Museum's building currently functioning as a parking facility. The purchase was financed through a local bank. The promissory note for \$835,000 matures October 1, 2012, with interest payable monthly at the 30 day LIBOR rate plus 2.5% (2.69% at June 30, 2011).

Note 12 – Employee Benefits

The Museum maintained a 403(b) Employee Salary Reduction Plan (the 403(b) Plan) which allowed employees to make savings contributions with pre-tax dollars. All full-time OKCMOA employees over age 18 were eligible to participate. Under the 403(b) Plan, the Museum did not make any contributions on behalf of participants. During 2010, all funds held in the Plan were distributed to plan participants.

In 2006, the Museum solicited contributions to enhance retirement benefits for its employees. During 2011 and 2010, the Museum did not receive any pledges in support of this program. At June 30, 2011 and 2010, \$500 of these pledges are included in grants and contributions receivable with restrictions (see Note 4).

Effective January 1, 2006, the Museum established the Oklahoma City Museum of Art 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan (the 457(b) Plan), which is intended to provide deferred compensation primarily for a select group of management and highly compensated employees covered by the 457(b) Plan. Eligible participants may make elective deferrals and the Museum, upon approval of the Board of Trustees, may make employer contributions. During the year ended June 30, 2010, the Museum approved elective deferrals of \$16,500 to the 457(b) Plan. In March 2010, all funds held in the 457(b) Plan were distributed to plan participants.

Effective January 1, 2007, the Museum established the Oklahoma City Museum of Art 401(k) Retirement Plan (the 401(k) Plan), which is offered to all employees of the Museum and the Café. Employees who have completed one year of credited service (as defined) and are at least 21 years of age are eligible to participate in the 401(k) Plan. In addition to employee elective deferrals into the 401(k) Plan, the Museum may make a matching contribution at the discretion of the Board of Trustees. Matching and other contributions by the Museum vest gradually over a six-year period. All reasonable expenses incurred in administering the 401(k) Plan are paid out of the principal or interest of the 401(k) Plan assets. The Museum may pay any such expenses of the 401(k) Plan at its discretion. During the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, the Museum approved matching or other retirement contributions of \$59,906 and \$52,259, respectively, to the 401(k) Plan.

Note 13 – Commitments

During the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, the Museum entered into contractual agreements with certain art exhibit leasing organizations for future exhibits. Exhibit lease commitments for the year ending June 30, 2012, are \$249,500. The Museum is soliciting contributions and other sources of support to fund these commitments.

Under the Café's operating statement, all costs and expenses of the Café's operations are the responsibility of the Café. However, if the Café incurs operating costs in excess of revenues from its operations (measured on a cash basis), the Museum may advance funds to the Café. No funds were advanced to the Café in 2011 or 2010.
