With My Tour Group or Class**



I am very excited to visit the Oklahoma City Museum of Art with my group. At the Museum I will see many types of art: paintings, sculptures, and glass. I will explore and have fun with my class. I can ask my group leader how long we will be visiting the Museum.

The Oklahoma City Museum of Art is in downtown Oklahoma City. Because it is a busy area, there could be lots of traffic driving to the Museum.



My group will be dropped off at the entrance to the Museum. I will wait for my group leader to take us into the Museum.



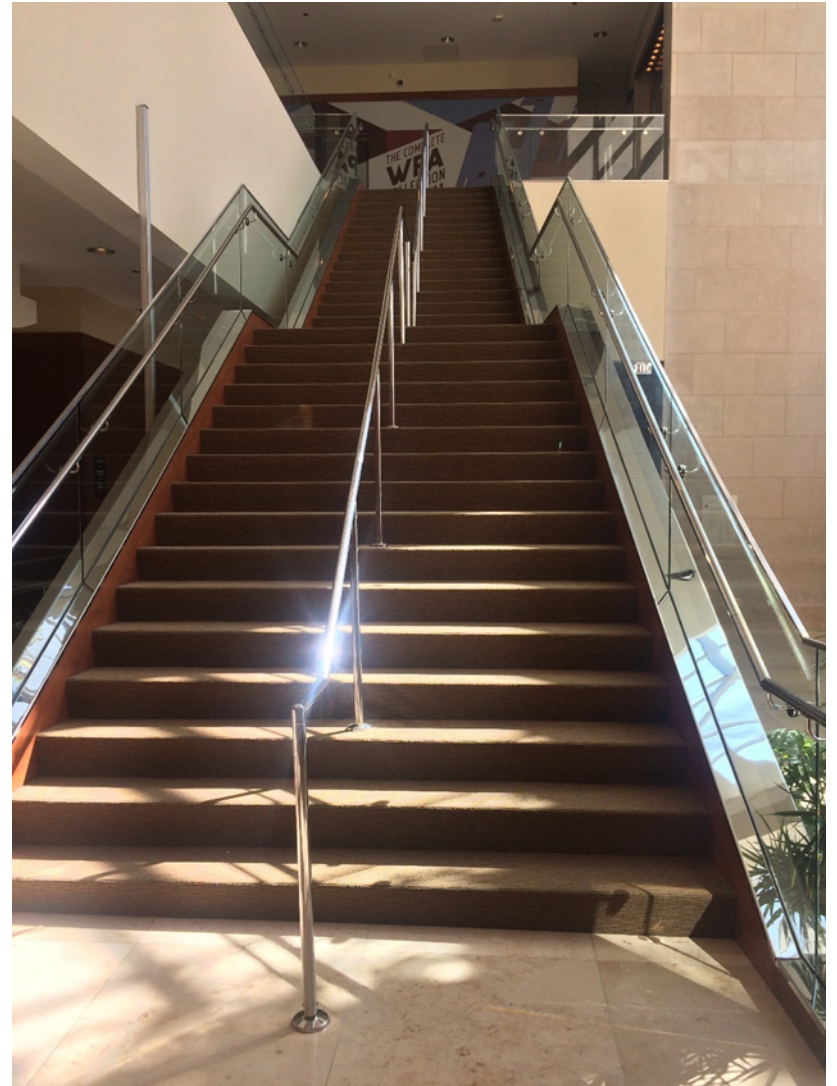
The Museum lobby has high ceilings and lots of windows. This means it may be very bright. It may also be loud because the sounds may echo. I might hear music playing.



If it is too loud, I can bring headphones. Or, my group leader can borrow headphones from the Front Desk Attendant at the Admissions Desk.



My group will meet with a docent before going into the galleries. This meeting will take place in the lobby or in the Museum Theater. The docent, who will be my tour guide, will go over the rules and tell my group about the tour.



To get to the galleries we will take the stairs. If I need to use the elevator, I will tell my group leader or docent.



On the 2nd and 3rd floors, there are railings, and I can see the floor(s) below. If this makes me uncomfortable, I can stand away from the railing.



Restrooms are on each floor across from the elevator. The toilets in all the restrooms flush automatically. They can be loud, but only for a short time.



During the tour I will stay with my group. If I get lost I will ask a Gallery Attendant for help. He or she will be wearing a blue jacket and white shirt. **This is very important.**



While I am with my group, I will walk in the galleries. I will be walking a lot. If I get tired I will ask my group leader if I can rest.



In the galleries I will stand or sit behind the black line. This is to keep me and the art safe. I will also keep my hands to myself and not touch the walls, pedestals, or art. This is very important.



Some of the galleries have bright lights.



Other galleries are dark.

Some of the lights make a buzzing sound.



I will have fun exploring and seeing art with my group. If I have questions, I will ask them when it is my turn.



I will remember to walk carefully in the Museum.



My group might eat lunch at the Museum. We could be in the basement, a classroom, or outside. I can't eat or drink in the galleries.





When my group leaves, we will probably exit the same door we entered.
