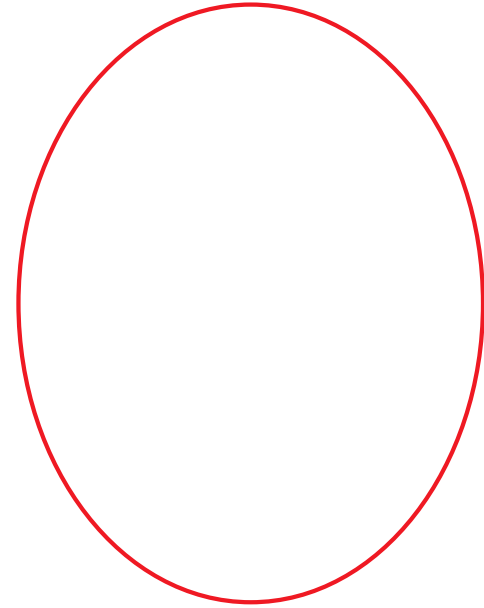


DRAW A PORTRAIT

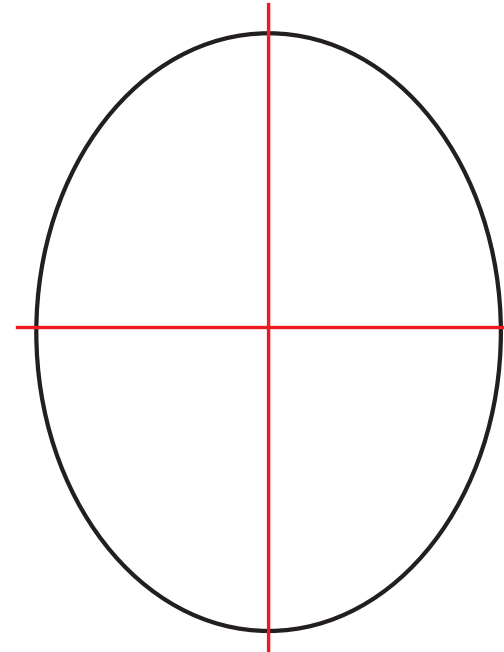
OF YOURSELF OR A FRIEND

A portrait is a picture of a specific person. Even though everyone has unique features, there are rules of proportion that can be used to draw a person's face. These rules help us draw the parts of the face the right size and put them in the right place. Use the rules of proportion to draw a portrait of yourself or a friend with you today.

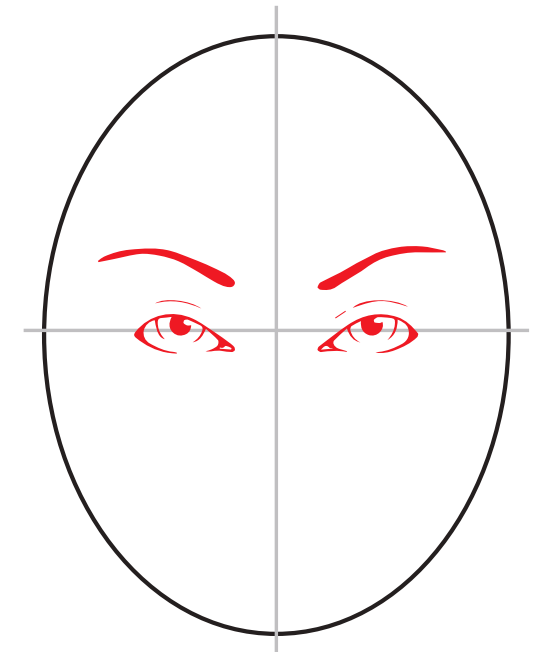
1 Draw an oval.



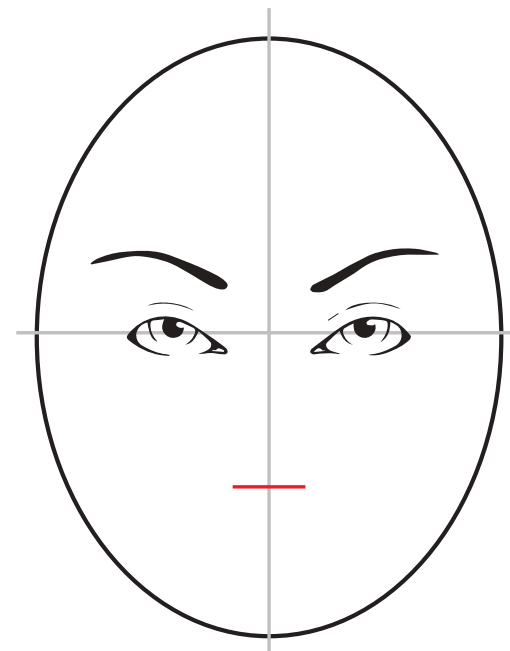
2 Divide the oval into four equal pieces. Draw these lines *lightly*! You'll erase them later.



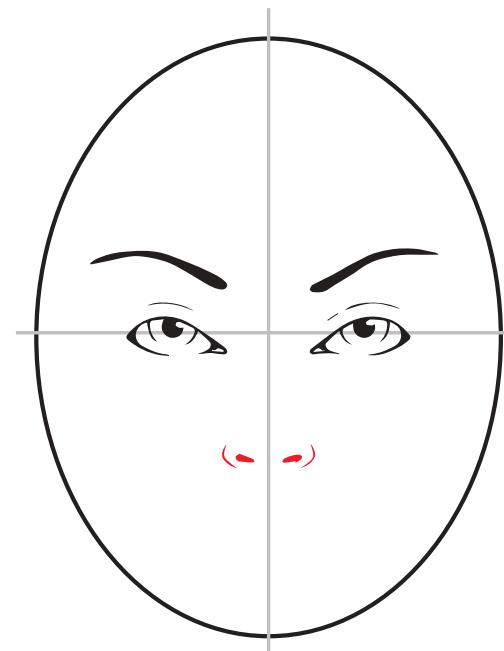
3 Draw the eyes on the line. Your face is about five eyes wide. Don't forget eyebrows!



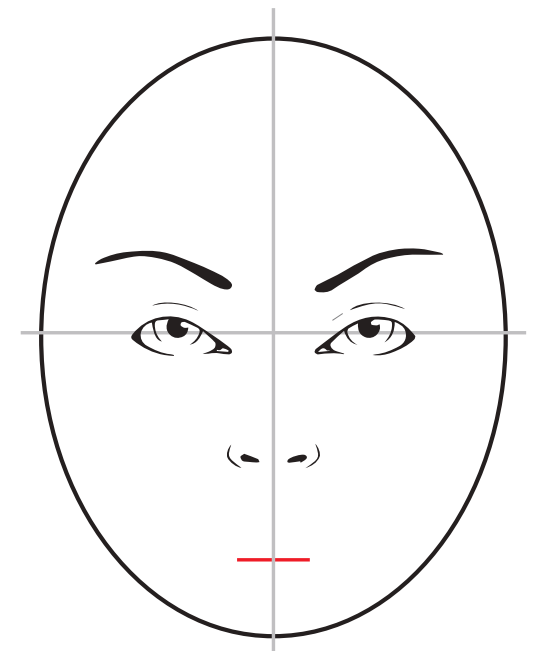
4 Draw a line halfway between your eyes and chin.



5 Then, draw the nose on that line.



6 Draw a line halfway between the nose and chin.

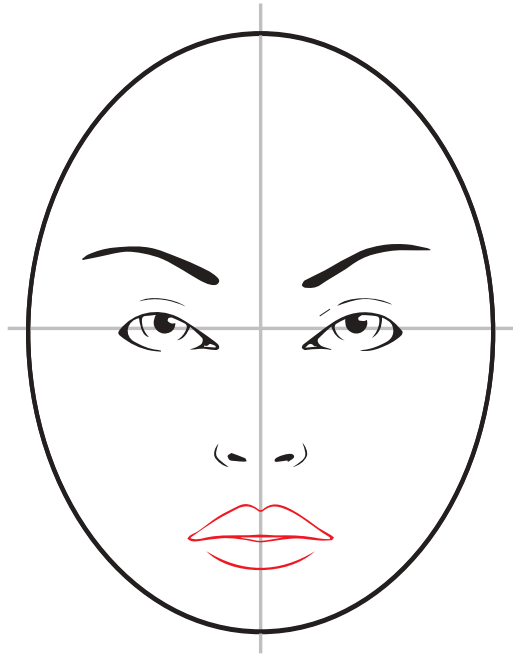

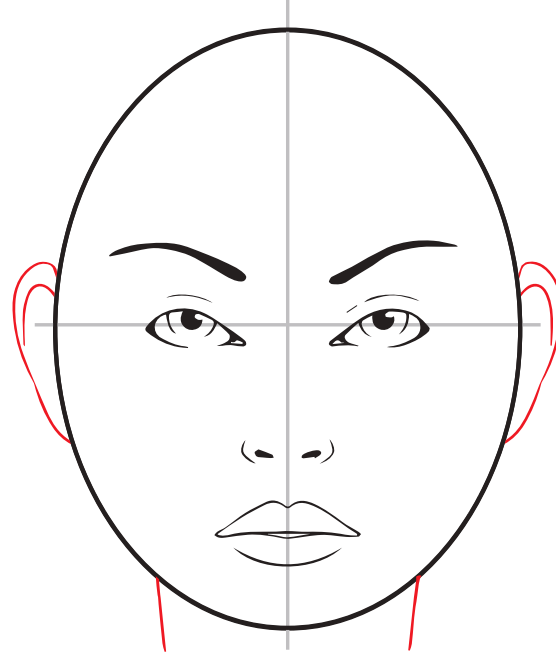

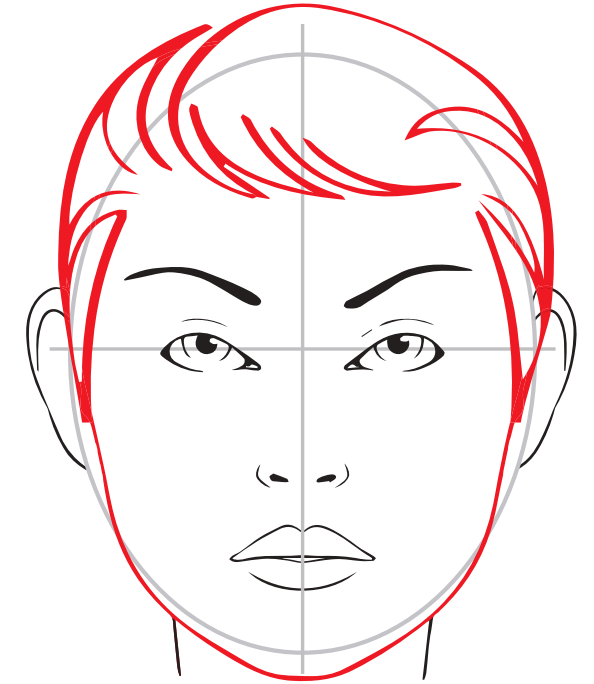
7 Then, add the mouth. The bottom of the lip touches this line.



8 The ears fit between the eyes and the nose. The neck starts just below the ears. No skinny necks! It will look too wide until the hair is added.



9 Define the chin. Add hair below and above the top of the head. Each hair can be drawn as a line



10 Erase all of the guidelines. Add details such as glasses, freckles, jewelry, etc.



11 Display!
